## OUST THE MODI GOVERNMENT RE-ESTABLISH DEMOCRATIC AND SECULAR VALUES

The All India Forward Bloc, the party founded by Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose is participating in the current election 2019 to elect the 17<sup>th</sup> Lok Sabha with an aim to increase its participation in the Parliament, ensure the defeat of BJP and to re-establish the time-tested values of our democracy and secularism.

The country has witnessed serious threats to the democratic and secular traditions of our country. The government of the day has shown its apathy towards the democratic norms of governance and exhibited the entire symptoms of fascism. The Modi government has failed to check the ever increasing price rise of all commodities. The trades particularly the wholesale stockists have made wind fall profits through black-marketing and hoardings. The prices of fuel, gas, power, water, vegetables, fruits, cereals, life saving medicines, study materials and other consumer items have increased manifold during this period. The economic policy of the government particularly the demonetization and unscientific implementation of GST have put the common people under severe crisis. The overall GDP growth shows downward trend. The agriculture sector shows negative growth. The government has failed to prevent the terrorist activities, which poses serious internal security problem. The foreign policy has become subservient to US dictates. Many incidents amply prove that this government has no collective responsibility. In many occasions, the government has compromised with the national sovereignty with foreign companies and countries.

The Modi government has allowed the domestic and foreign finance capital forces to plunder the natural assets as a part of its neo-liberal policies. The government, which is reluctant to extend subsidy to the farmers and poor has extended generous exemptions to the corporates and allowed the bank defaulters to leave the country after looting the banks. Not only the minerals the government is handing over the water resources also to the private companies. Allowing FDI in retail trade is another policy liberalisation of the government, which is detrimental to the interests of the nation in general and 20 crore retail traders in particular. Allowing private companies to open banks and the gradual closing down of the postal department are shows that the government is relinquishing its responsibility to provide necessary services to the general public and handing over them to private monopoly capitals.

### Strategy of AIFB

The All India Forward Bloc is of the opinion that the main characteristics of the current government are (i) communalism in thoughts, (ii) fascism in vision, (iii) liberalization and crony capitalism in practice, (iv) intolerance in action and (vi) autocracy in administration. Therefore it is the duty of the democracy loving and secular minded people to mobilize their entire might to dethrone this anti-people government. In order to materialize this target, the party will evolve with a strategy to explore the possibility of (i) forging alliance with left parties, (ii) understanding with secular – democratic parties, (iii) contest independently to propagate the politics of Forward

Bloc and relevance of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose (iv) and to take all possible steps to consolidate anti-BJP votes.

With this target, the AIFB is setting up candidates in as many as 15 states.
